Review of the Cannes - Côte d'Azur Dance Festival France 2023 : A celebration of the world's dancing diversity

From November 24 to December 10, the Festival de Danse Cannes - Côte d'Azur France 2023 dazzled dance professionals and enthusiasts alike, offering a symphony of movement, culture and discovery under the inspiring artistic direction of Didier Deschamps.

« For almost three weeks, Cannes and the Côte d'Azur were alive with the rhythms of "Dance". Accompanied by the festival's formidable teams, each artist offered us a singular vision of the world, its beauties and its questionings, with as many ways of thinking about movement, mobilizing the body and sharing emotions and sometimes astonishments with us.

With the support of 8 Côte d'Azur cultural organisations, united around the Palais des Festivals in Cannes, Anthéa - Antibes, Forum Jacques Prévert - Carros, Scène 55 - Mougins, Théâtre Le Forum - Fréjus, Théâtres en Dracénie - Draguignan, Théâtre de Grasse, Théâtre La Licorne - Cannes La Bocca, Théâtre national de Nice, the event covered an essential aspect of contemporary artistic creation dear to the city of Cannes. Dance was showcased on the stages of theatres across the Côte d'Azur and in Cannes, too, in the public space, on facades and screens... Intense moments for all dance professionals and enthusiasts, presenting a symphony of cultures and discoveries.

Diversity and openness

This year's festival was a hymn to diversity, bringing together 27 companies from 13 countries to celebrate the richness of choreographic expression.

Each dance company invited over the three weeks brilliantly showcased the vivacity of contemporary dance, invariably capturing the essence of our humanity.

Transdisciplinarity and discovery

Exploring the boundaries between dance and other artistic disciplines was at the heart of the festival, showcasing cross-disciplinary performances between dance, circus, song and music, as well as cinema and new technologies, offering an immersive and captivating experience.

Training and education

At the heart of this celebration, the spotlight was on young people, with dazzling performances by France's five national dance schools, who opened the Festival on 24 November.

The week dedicated to these five schools was a time for sharing, reflection and teaching, underlining the importance of training and integrating future professionals.

As part of the 100% EAC programme set up by the City of Cannes, the Festival is continuing its work to develop the audiences of tomorrow. As of the start of the 2023 school year, Cannes schoolchildren have been made aware of the Festival's work through practical workshops and eye-opening visits to their schools by dancers and choreographers programmed at the Festival.

Unique creations

The festival saw a number of world and French premieres, offering a striking panorama of artistic diversity. New works were created, mixing contemporary themes with traditional expressions, creating unique artistic experiences by taking over 13 stages in the region, including more or less surprising places in the urban space to meet all audiences.

MOV'IN Cannes: Dance in the image, a successful premiere

The international dance film competition, MOV'IN Cannes, celebrated dance through the cinematic lens, offering a platform for filmmakers and directors to capture the essence of movement.

The winners of this first edition were chosen by a jury of directors, choreographers and dance professionals chaired by Mathilda May, author, director and actress.

Commitment and international influence

Since 1985, the Festival de Danse Cannes - Côte d'Azur France has been committed to promoting dance as a major art form, offering a diverse and accessible programme. Its international reputation has made it a benchmark on the world choreographic scene.

This year's festival, directed by Didier Deschamps, was not only a vibrant testament to different cultures and artistic expressions, but also a celebration of the art of dance in all its diversity. The Festival de Danse Cannes - Côte d'Azur France 2023 will be remembered as an ode to universal creativity, open-mindedness and a passion for dance that knows no borders.

The 2023 Festival in figures

15,000 festival-goers, including 171 professionals and 34 journalists from the national and international press

In the run-up to the Festival, awareness-raising activities with:
